The Paper Pulpit

(Reflections from the Pastor)

7th Sunday in Easter (The Ascension of the Lord)

Scripture: "No sooner had he said this than he was lifted up before their eyes in a cloud which took him from their sight. They were still gazing up into the heavens when two men dressed in white stood beside them. "Men of Galilee," they said, "why do you stand here looking up at the skies? This Jesus who has been taken from you will return, just as you saw him go up into the heavens." Acts 1:1-11

Jesus' Ascension into heaven was both an end and a beginning. While it was the end of Jesus' physical presence with his disciples, it marked the beginning of Jesus' presence with them in a new way. Jesus promised that he would be with them always to the end of time. Now as Jesus ascended to the right hand of the Father in heaven, Jesus promised to give them the power of his Holy Spirit, which we see fulfilled ten days later on the Feast of Pentecost (Luke 24:49 and Acts 2:1-4). When the Lord Jesus departed physically from the Apostles, they were not left alone or powerless. Jesus assured them of his presence and the power of the Holy Spirit.

Jesus' last words to his Apostles point to his saving mission and to their mission to be witnesses of his saving death and his glorious resurrection and to proclaim the good news of salvation to all the world. No one did this more than Paul the Apostle. Their task is to proclaim the good news of salvation to all the world. God's love and gift of salvation is for the whole world – for all who will accept it. The gospel is the power of God, the power to forgive sins, to heal, to deliver from evil and oppression, and to restore life.

This is the great commission which the risen Christ gives to the whole Church. All believers have been given a share in this task – to be heralds of the good news, to work for and be ambassadors for Jesus Christ. We have not been left alone in this task, for the risen Lord works in and through us by the power of his Holy Spirit through the Church. Today we witness a new Pentecost as the Lord pours out his Holy Spirit upon his people to renew and strengthen the Body of Christ and to equip it for effective ministry and mission world-wide.

Speaking of ministry, over the past few weeks I have mentioned the need of volunteers in a number of areas in the parish. To help with the prayer garden. To help clean the church. To help count money. To help teach or assist with CCD. To help with the music ministry program. To sign up for the Knights of Columbus (men's group). To sign up for an area of interest you may have in the parish among others. Thank you for those who stepped up and many of you have. But not everyone has. Some folks think that "Someone Else" will do it. So last week at the end of Mass I mentioned we had a death in the parish. The death of... Someone Else.

I got this story from the internet... Someone's passing created a vacancy that will be difficult to fill. Else has been with us for many years and Someone did far more than the normal person's share of the work. Whenever leadership was mentioned, this person was looked to for inspiration as well as results. Someone Else can work with that group. Whenever there was a job to do, CCD to teach, clean a window, plant a flower, or a meeting to attend, one name was on everyone's lips, "Let Someone Else do it."

Were the truth known, everyone expected too much of Someone Else. Now Someone Else is gone. We wonder what we are going to do. Someone Else left a wonderful example to follow, but who is going to follow it? Who is going to do the things Someone Else did? Remember, we can't depend on Someone Else anymore. So we need you. Please see Fr. Jim on how you can help "Someone Else" out.
